The afternoon session saw the winds increase to around 4 to 8 knots with a few strong gusts of 15 knots. Boat handling and managing the puffs were key to keeping the slightly overpowered SeaWinds upright and sailing fast.

In the end, it was Brad Russell taking first place with 64 points. Andy Russell made an afternoon charge at first but came up just short, finishing second with 67 points. Steve Helander rounded out the podium, finishing third with 88 points. We also had ten of the nineteen skippers win a race over the 24-race event.
